THE BRADFORD ANTIQUARY:

AUTHOR AND SUBJECT INDEX 1881-2021

This index is a guide to the contents of the *Bradford Antiquary* from its first issue in 1881, though to its eighty-second in 2021, a continuous run covering 141 years. Book reviews are not included.

Arrangement Articles are entered in two sequences - Author and Subject.

Selection of terms In the Subject Index, the most specific term generally has been used, with references and multiple entries used where appropriate. 'Bradford' is assumed unless noted otherwise or is part of a name, for example 'Bradford Canal', or to entries which would be unclear by themselves, such as Bradford Bibliography. Buildings have been entered specifically under their own name, thus 'Stott Hill Hall'.

Citing Over the years a variety of numbering systems of volumes, parts and issues have been adopted which can cause confusion. The nomination 'Old Series' and 'New Series' is disregarded in this index and the volumes have been taken to run consecutively from Vol. 1 (Old Series) to Vol. 12 (New Series Vol. 10), after which volume numbers ceased to be used and part numbers used instead – the Third Series. Hence Vol.9 (New Series Vol.7) is referred to as Vol.9 and the 'N.S.' designation ignored, a practice adopted by the journal's editors in 1921.

- Articles in Volumes 1 to 12 (1881-1982) are cited using the Volume and page numbers only;
- Articles in the Third Series (1985-2015) are cited noting: '3rd series' followed by Part 'Number' and pagination;
- From 2016, entries are identified using by the number of issue and pagination

Roman numerals have been converted to Arabic numerals for ease of use.
